## About Us

The Palmyra Eagle Community Band was formed in 1993 through the efforts of Band Manager, Alice Ventura. There were 4 musicians present at the first rehearsal. The first concert was presented on June 14<sup>th</sup>, Flag Day, in the village park.. Through the years, membership has grown to about 30 members.

The members are of all ages from retirees (some of whom had not played their instruments since their school days) to college and high school students. They come from various communities in the area and as far away as Madison.

Under the direction of "Mr. Ed" Pierce of Fort Atkinson, the musical selections range from marches to show tunes, familiar popular melodies to classical.

We encourage anyone interested in dusting off the old horn to join us. Rehearsal is Monday evening, 7:00 pm, at the high school band room. Our concert schedule shows the types of venues the band plays at throughout the spring and summer. Usually, we have a break after the last park concert in August until after Labor Day. Then we begin to prepare for an October visit to Fairhaven and our two Holiday Concerts held in early December after which we break again for the holidays.

The band is all volunteer and supported by contributions from local businesses, civic groups and generous individuals.

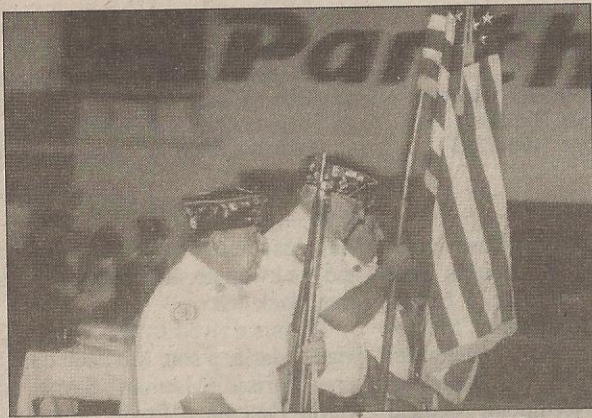

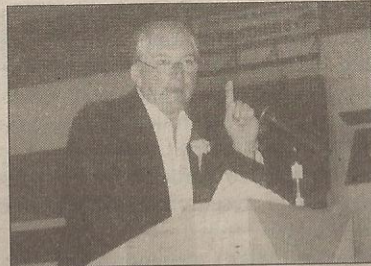

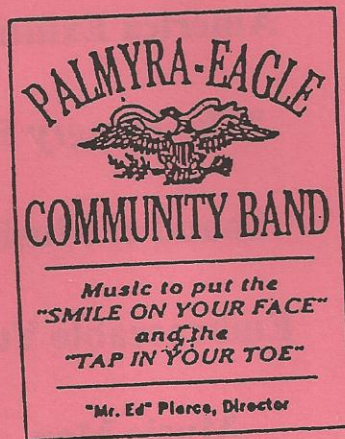
