PECB Board Meeting Minutes  
January 19, 2009

Meeting called to order at 7:00 pm by President Jim Nelson at the home of Director Gwenn Zerull. Members present were: Jim Nelson, President; Mary (Mickey) Nelson, Secretary; Barb Sekula, Treasurer; Alice Ventura, Band Manager; Bob Miller, Director; Gwenn Zerull, Director; Deb Gilbert, Music Librarian; Ed Pierce, Conductor.

First order of business was review of the budget from 2008. Barb distributed Financial Statements: Year End Report, Year End Finance Report, Year End Expense Report. Bob distributed an item by item detail report of 2008 financial activities. Reports show that Band is within budget for 2008 with more income than expenses. Checkbook balance as of 12/31/08 is \$2,584.33.

Election of officers for 2009 was held. Jim Nelson nominated for president again and accepted. Barb Sekula for treasurer and accepted. Mary Nelson nominated for secretary but respectfully declined due to health issue. She will continue as a Director until her term expires in 2009. Gwenn Zerull nominated for secretary and accepted. Slate was elected by unanimous voice vote.

The Conflict of Interest statement was distributed and signed by all members. This is a yearly requirement by government for 503C (3) non-profits.

Next the 2009 Band Concert schedule was worked out. Barb said the Methodist Church would like to hold a Fat Tuesday Pancake Supper on February 24<sup>th</sup> and wanted the band to play. Gwenn will poll members by e-mail to see how many would be available on that date. Tentative schedule was worked out based on last year's activity.

Conductor's contract was reviewed. Stipend will be same as last year \$75.00 per rehearsal and each concert. Motion to approve by Mary N, second by Deb G. Approved by unanimous voice voted.

Developing a web site for the band has been discussed with Jim Neist. Mike Rubingh has volunteered to help. Neither were present so item tabled.

Discussion about obtaining new summer shirts. Mary N. volunteered to work on this and will ask a couple band members to help. Everyone would pay for own as in past. Band would purchase a few extras for sit-in musicians.

Meeting was adjourned at about 8:30 pm.

# Community Band elects new officers

The Palmyra-Eagle Community Band's Board of Directors recently elected new officers: President, Bob Miller; Secretary, Gwenn Zerull; and Treasurer, Barbara Sekula.

The band was formed in 1993 under the leadership of Alice Ventura, who now resides at the Fairhaven Community Center in Whitewater.

Its first rehearsal was held with 22 members present and has grown to 30, none of which were original members.

The band has had three directors since its conception. Glen Rehberg was the director for the first year followed by Meghan Zimmerman, a student from the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater the following summer. Ed Pierce took over after that and has been the band director ever since.

In 2007 the band became incorporated as a non-profit organization.

"We like the small town atmosphere where you can get to know people well and still be close to the bigger cities like Milwaukee and Madison," said Lucht.

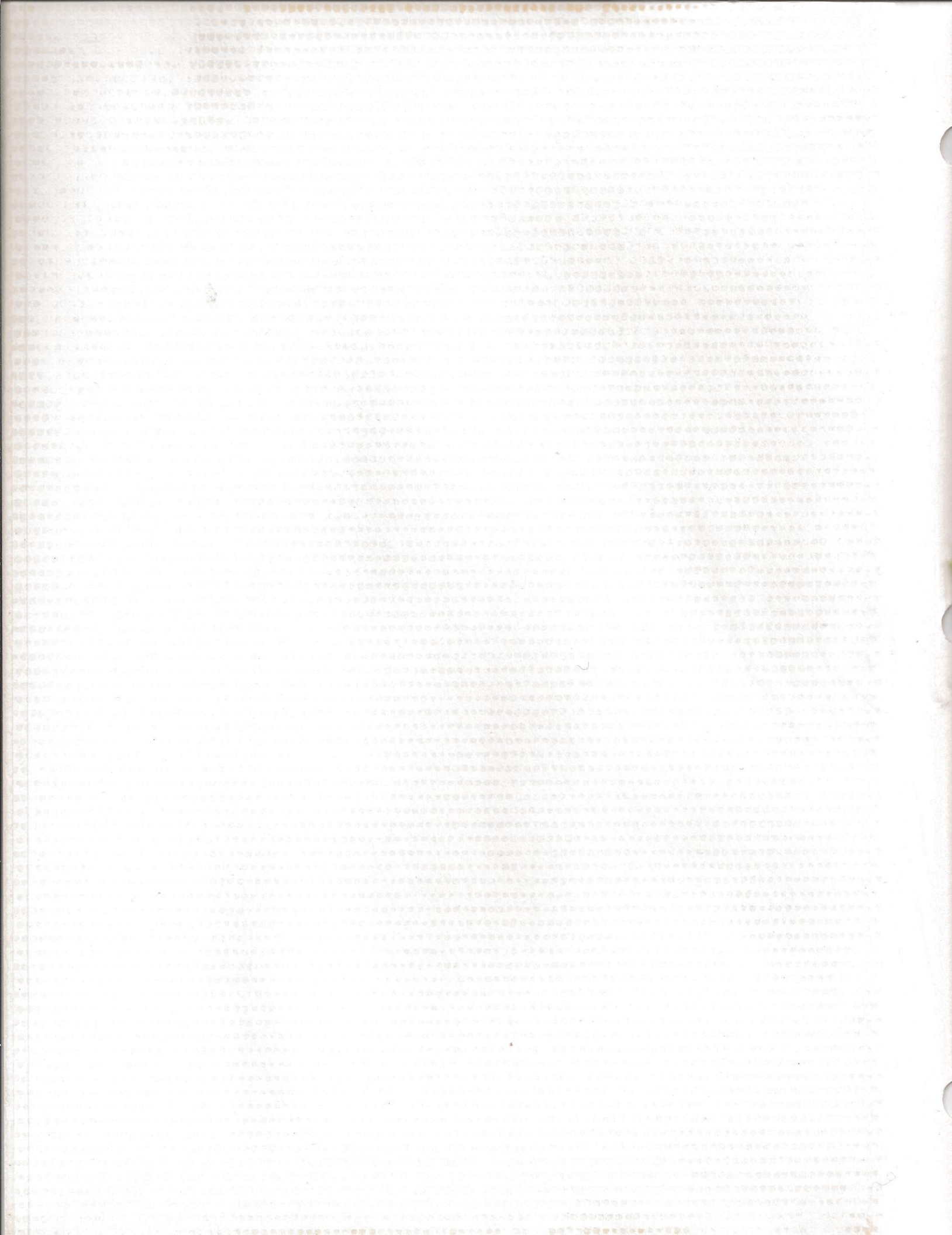

May 25, 2009

The meeting was called to order by Jim Nelson at 5:25 pm. Those in attendance were Jim and Gina Neist, Jim and Mickey Nelson, Barb Sekula, Alice Ventura and Gwenn Zerull.

Minutes were reviewed some discussion followed. As there were no additions or corrections, the minutes were approved as read.

Treasurer's Report: Attached. Barb reviewed the report with the board. We are still under budget for the year. The current checkbook balance is \$1802.37. She reported that deposits are comparable to last year.

Committee Reports:

School Day Concerts: There was discussion of having band members go to schools to put on a small concert and show some of the musical instruments to the children. We would need a few members who are free during the school day. Jim Nelson will work on that with a possible start in the Fall.

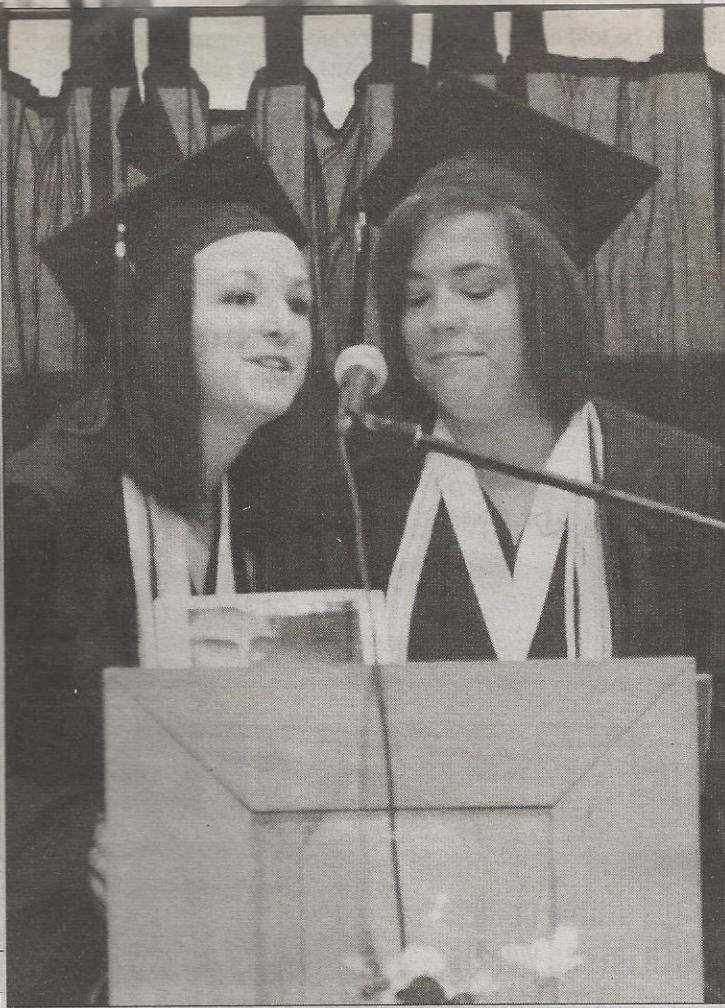

There was discussion on eliminating the Eagle Christmas concert. Alice made a motion to eliminate the Monday night Christmas concert in Eagle. The motion was seconded by Barb Sekula and passed on a voice vote. Gwenn will make changes to the schedule and distribute new ones at rehearsal.

Other business: Alice announced that she will no longer play with the band. She will stay on the board and continue working with the music. There was discussion of presenting Ed Pierce with a plaque in appreciation of his fifteen years with the band. Mickey Nelson moved that we obtain a plaque, the motion was seconded by Alice Ventura. The motion was carried on a voice vote. Mickey will investigate buying the plaque and we will present it at Christmas.

A motion to adjourn was made by Mickey Nelson, seconded by Alice Ventura and carried on a voice vote. Jim Nelson closed the meeting at 6:30 pm.

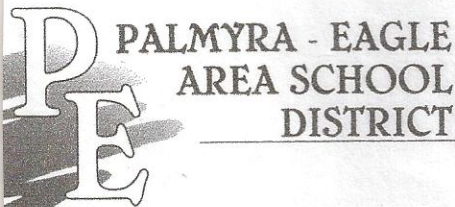

It has come to the attention of the district office, that the Palmyra-Eagle Community Band, Inc. has been using the High School/Middle School Band Room for rehearsals, but not being charged for the use of this room. After doing some research, it appears in the past the Community Band had used the Community Center for their rehearsals and at some point, relocated those practices to the Community Center.

Board Policy #830 Community Use of School Facilities – Including the Irvin L. Young Community Center may be used by the youth of the district, school-related organizations, and responsible community groups as prescribed by this school board policy. As a member of the community under section (b) of Who May Use, the Community Band is considered a group which may utilize the facilities. There is a Rental Fee Schedule under section (c) of Assignment of Rental Fees or Other Charges. Use of the high school / middle school band room falls within the fee schedule under “CLASSROOMS” and has a fee of \$10.00 per time used. The Curriculum & Policy Committee reviewed this policy at the last meeting and have decided to keep the policy as it is written.

At this time, as District Administrator, I feel it would be appropriate to waive the fee for the use of the high school / middle school band room by the Community Band for the 2009/2010 school year. If you have any concerns or comments, please feel free to contact me.
